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MEET YOUR FACULTY



Nancy Blake, PhD, RN, CCRN-K, NHDP-BC, NEA-BC, FACHE, FAONL, FAAN, is the Chief Nursing Officer at LAC+USC Medical Center. She was the Chief Nursing Officer at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center from March of 2019 until June of 2021. Prior to that position, she was the director of critical care services at Children's Hospital Los Angeles (CHLA) for more than 30 years where she helped CHLA achieve Magnet designation. She is a national speaker on pediatric disaster preparedness, staffing, and healthy work environments. She received her BSN from Mount Saint Mary's College in Los Angeles; she received her Master's in Nursing from UCLA in Nursing Administration, and most recently received her PhD in nursing at UCLA. In addition, she is the co-editor of a book titled *Nursing Management of Pediatric Disaster*. Dr. Blake was inducted as a fellow in the Academy of Nursing in 2013. She is an Associate Adjunct Professor at UCLA School of Nursing and was recently named the Distinguished Alumni Member for 2021. She has received a DAISY Health Equity Grant for 2021 for a research study titled "Exploring Social Determinants of Health and Vaccine Declination: Pilot Survey of Adults within a Safety Net Healthcare System." She is a fellow in the American College of Healthcare Executives, the American Organization of Nurse Leaders, and the American Academy of Nursing.



Dr. Allison Luu is the Patient Safety Officer at LAC+USC Medical Center and Assistant Professor of Emergency Medicine for the Keck School of Medicine. She completed a Quality Improvement and Leadership Fellowship at LAC+USC after finishing her Emergency Medicine residency there. She now serves as a Co-Director of the fellowship and is the Director of the Healthcare Administration Scholars Program (HASP) for residents interested in leadership careers and quality improvement. In addition to working on hospital harm events, Dr. Luu is a Master Trainer for TeamSTEPPS and a Just Culture advocate. Dr. Luu is also an advocate for staff second victim support and is the Director of the Helping Healers Heal (H3) second victim program at LAC+USC. Dr. Luu received her Medical Degree from Tufts University School of Medicine and received her master's degree from the University of California, Irvine in Biomedical Engineering. She also received patient safety training at the Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) at the Patient Safety Executive Development Program.
